



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT A FEDERAL SPECIAL CANADA GOOSE PERMIT

The special Canada goose permit is a permit issued by us to a State wildlife agency authorizing certain resident Canada goose management and control activities that are normally prohibited. We will only issue such a permit when it will contribute to human health and safety, protect personal property, or allow resolution or prevention of injury to people or property. The management and control activities conducted under the permit are intended to relieve or prevent injurious situations only.

If you are a landowner, homeowner's association, public land manager, or local government in the lower 48 states or the District of Columbia, you may register at this site: <https://epermits.fws.gov/eRCGR/geSl.aspx> for federal authorization to destroy resident Canada goose nests and eggs on property under your jurisdiction.
